Thanks for the correspondence and keeping us up to date. It's been a while since we worked on this proposal but it's just as relevant as ever: training remains a priority as does support for the negotiation process.

With respect to both these areas there have been some developments in the last year. We now talk of 'district health systems development' which you can read about in our annual report, which is included. The work, however, is on ice until we find funding to employ someone in this position. In response, as part of a larger funding proposal which was submitted to ODA, we have requested them to cover 'district health systems development' as well. This would overlap with item 8.3 of your proposal and you should just be aware of it.

Regarding training, our management training course is set to start in January 1994. All six clinics have candidates for the course but await funding. If this is not forthcoming soon they will miss the boat.

In spite of the disappointment around this proposal's failure last year we remain hopeful. Knowing that you've out there patting for us makes a big difference. It would be nice to see you again so if you pass this way make sure that you look us up.
