Ever since this problem

affected the minds and the relations of a large part of mankii¬\201d the intellectual vanguard of our modern society sought to interpret the various concepts of race. Many of the definitions that were given and that are even today being used, were subjective, unsciehtific add inaccurate.

It should be borne in mind that the problem of racial discriminiation is a relatively redent phenomenom in human relations.
