I guess you never received these letters and it is for that reason that I deemed it fit to attach them to this letter.

You are absolutely correct that I discussed three cdes with cde Khaya with the view to deploy them in the Treasury dept, except for cde Paul whose name never appeared. However, I should like to inform you that the Subject has been requested for by the acting Manager of the Farm Project. Cde Maseko ever since I joined this dept, deployment at the farm has always been done at the request of the farm Manager or his deputy and I have evidence to that effect. I am under the impression that cde Caiphus is the acting Farm Manager.

The following are due to leave on scholarship, However, neither you nor cde Khaya have approached me on the question of replacements. viz. Dick Dloane, Joyce Mohamed, Dinakatse Makgetha Tshol Mphethe and Caiphus.

I find it discouraging that whenever I try to stabilise certain depts, I am barred by authorities above me. I therefore kindly request you to clearly define the working relationship with regard to D.M.D., The Farm Manager and Cde Khaya.

Furhtermore I must say I am dismayed at your syle of work. You dismissed the housing officer, and I hardly receive a note from you about his dismissal, and I must say that the absence of the housing officer af extremely affect my work.

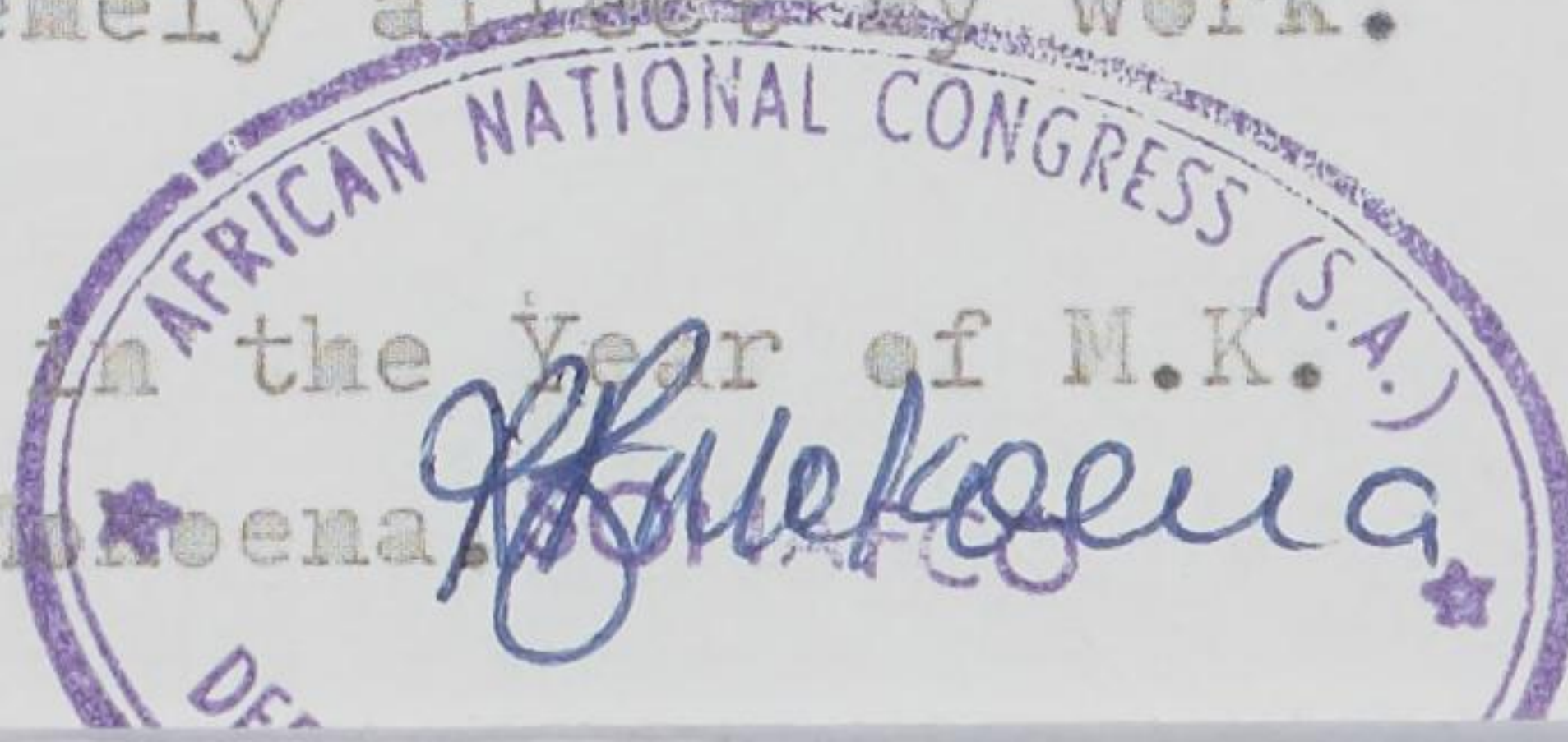

Re: Comrade Paul Manyika - 24 years old.

Comrade Paul returned to East Africa from the Soviet Union where he was studying, on the 3rd February 1986. He was accompanied by a comprehensive medical report with recommendations for observation and treatment.

Initially he was attended to by Comrade Dr. Pepe at Mazimbu and was subsequently seen by a specialist at Morogoro Hospital. The specialist @ is of the opinion that comrade Paul is suffering from masked depression.

Treatment was commenced on the 15th of May, 1986 with anti-depressants and tranquilizers. The immediate results are ~~very~~ incredible.

Comrade Paul's story is typical "A wandering patient from one doctor to the other suffering groans and moans without relief". His attitude to his illness and treatment is very ~~positive~~ positive and encouraging.

When he completes the six weeks course of treatment he will be in utmost health. He is due for review on the 3rd of July 1986 at Morogoro.

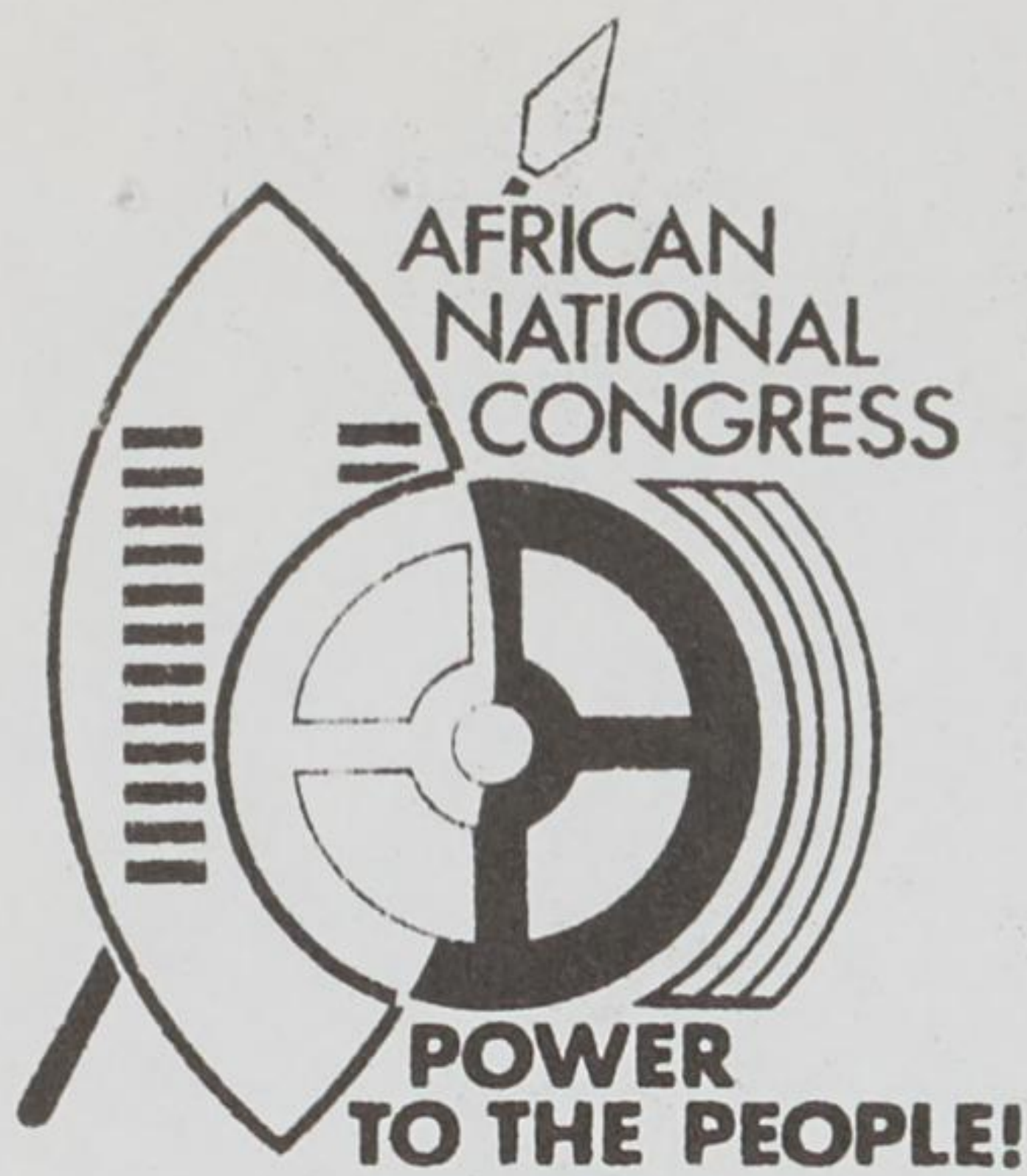

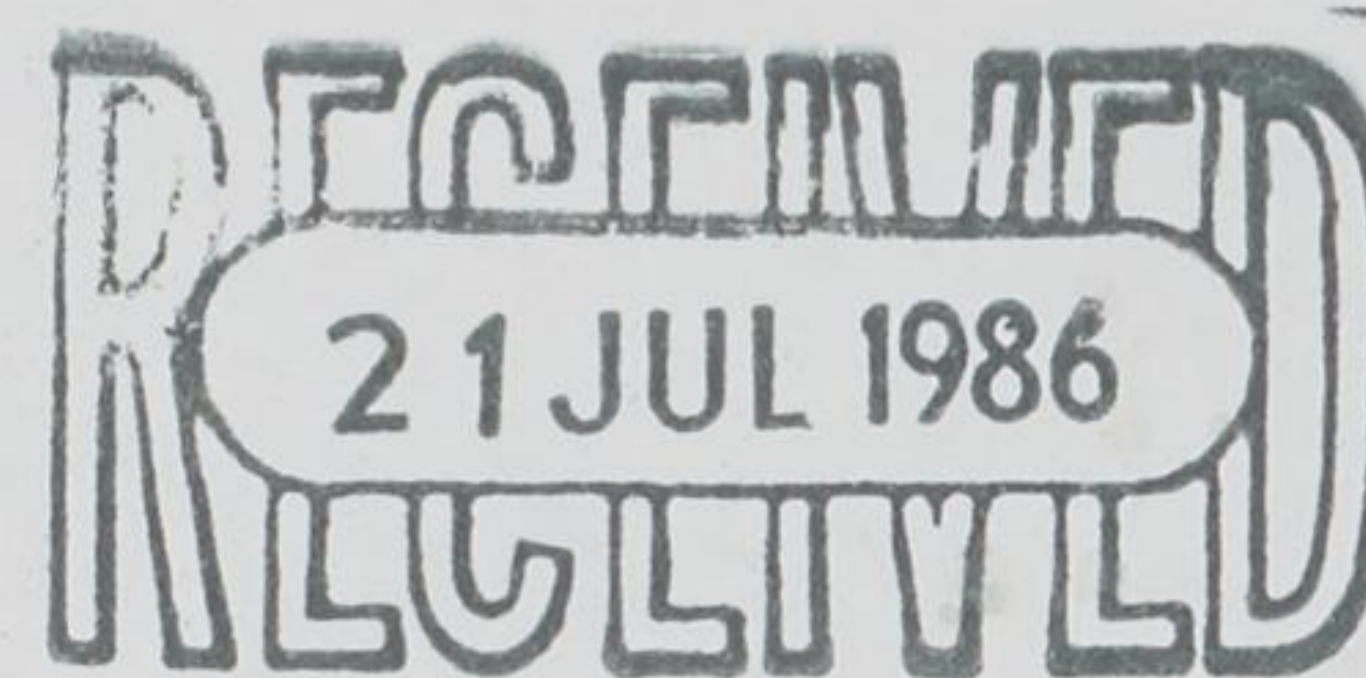

Thanks for your note of 24th instant on the above subject. You say Paul has been deployed to the farm. I understand from comrade Khaya that you submitted to him names of returned completed students in Dakawa about 2-3 days ago. The question of Paul was never mentioned to him.

As you know that before deployment of a person is effected, the Head of the Department has first to be approached or conversely the Head requests the Personnel Office to identify some-one needed. It would appear that this was not so in the above case.

As far as I can recall when Paul returned from the USSR at the beginning of the year, he alleged that he was very sick and had to go to Muhimbili for "further treatment". Has he been now cured of the ailment? Has he been allowed by Dakawa Administration to be deployed in Mazimbu?

With regard to accomodation, there is still a problem and generally this should first be secured before deployment to avoid disappointment to the person concerned. Please take up the case of Paul with Khaya before his assignment.

The Committee was not happy with the manner in which Hansen tried to solve his problems and his refusal to accept the changes in the new structure which were meant to alleviate the problems.

The Committee, therefore, reluctantly arrived at the decision that no other assignment can be offered to Hansen. I am fully aware of the inconvenience this case has caused to your organisation.
