SUBJECT: Comrade ^Arthur reports:

A meeting was held with Cds. Hilda and Enos. Hilda conceded that Enos had not in fact used abusive language but was insulting in the sense of being arrogant and talking to an older person disrespectfully. (not in African culture!)

Enos apologised and stated that because of the quarrel he had found it difficult to enter her house or speak to her when maintenance requests were made. However, the meeting ended amicably and peacefully - the comrades shook hands and Enos then promised to re-examine their housing problems.

Dear Comrade,

Revolutionary greetings.

This is in connection with the problem that I am and have been having with Cde Enos, the housing officer. When I came back from treatment in the Soviet Union, I found the children whom I left in the house in hazards, due to the changes which were made in the house. The children were moved to the dormitories and Cde Martin was given that room. Anyway, one of them after a discussion with the Body-Master came back and I found her sleeping in the dining-room. I was not happy that the children were taken out of the house during my absence since an agreement of staying with them was made.

The thing that did not satisfy me is that cde Martin stayed with the girlfriend and there is Sams family. too in the house moreover in the rooms which are meant for single people, as a result the house was really crowded. I complained to cde Enos but all in vain. The matter was also referred to the Womens Section who convened a joint meeting involving cdes Enos and Martin. The outcome was that I got insulted by both cdes Enos and Martin and Enos never sought alternative accommodation for Martin. In fact I would not mind Martin staying in the house I even told Enos that due to the overcrowdedness even Sams family can be moved if there is accommodation elsewhere because I also accommodated them through cde Ntilashe when they were from Dar and no accommodation was available. But then Martin had to leave since we were not in good terms already. I told Enos that it is only when Martin and Sam leave that he could accommodate somebody else. Ultimately Martin left sometime in October, but to my surprise just the following day of his departure Enos brought cde Mahlasela to stay in.

When he was just at the door with cde Mahlaselas luggage I resisted him to come in the house. Not that I did not want cde Mahlasela to stay in, but that not until Sams family is moved then somebody could occupy the room and the children theirs, as it has or used to be. As I resisted to enos move I got hurt in the process as he was pushing me with the luggage (mostly my operation got disturbed). The very day I went to report the matter to the Director who talked to him and told him to solve the problem of overcrowdedness before anybody could be brought in. Anyway that very day he left with cde Mahlasela and his luggage. Sam is still in the house and the children in their bedrooms.

I laid the complain to the Director of how I got hurt, and explained the whole set-up as stated above. The next thing I received a letter from the complex commissar (Cde Arthor), that was in November. The letter was stated that it was \$ \$ \$ \$ urgent and the theme on the matter I reported about Enos. I went to Arthors office the I was called but Arthor told me Enos did not turn-up, and that I could come back the following day. I went the following day and waited at Arthors office for four hours but later I was told that I should leave, as I will be called when he has turned-up.

I received the letter from the Director that stated the investigation to be carried out and that I will be called then by the Director or cde Arthor. That is until today I am still waiting, I have not been called. Meanwhile I am facing other problems in the house which concern Enos. These are problems of maintenance and Sams problem of accommodation. A lot of property need maintenance attention but whatever I report is not attended to and that gives me an impression that he has taken a personal grudge. Even then I should do not see the reason why I should suffer on the \$ \$ \$ \$ \$ \$ \$ \$ \$ \$ properties of the organisation or even the properties suffer depreciation while they could be maintained.

As for the grudge that has affected my spouse. Sam has been here from Dar for quite some time now. He has been waiting for accommodation. But whenever he goes to remind the housing officer, he (Enos) tells him that the (Enos) is

not prepared to move him from the house since his (Sam) mother wants to stay with her family. Enos has refused to accommodate Sam irrespective of how Sam tries to explain the matter, irrespective of Sam's patience. The other day he said to him he with the housing committee will have to have a meeting and discuss if Sam should have accommodation. Now the question arises what if they reach the conclusion that he should not be accommodated, where should he live or stay? Should he suffer because when he was from a congress mission his mother assisted the congress mission his mother assisted the congress by accommodating him?

Mainly I would like the above stated factors to be brought to his attention because I feel the relationship between me and him is not a healthy one, it is not that of comradeship.

In fact I brought this complaint to the R.P.C. not that I overlook the commissar and the Director, but because they are very busy and would like the case to be attended to fast so as to be able to eradicate other problems.
