Dear Chief,

I received your note the other day the other day:

- a). I received the parcel O.R. sent and good use has been made with it.
 - b) With our Swedish friend Oluf I am sending two books taken from our library.
 - c). Regarding problems of financing our Swaziland refugees we have had talks here with Commander Cunningham of the Amnesty International who informs us that some money has been allocated by their group for Swaziland. It appears though that the refugee committee in Swaziland is not functioning properly and is pro-PAC. In spite of this we feel that our chaps down there ought not to let such committees conduct themselves in a manner prejudicial to us.....after all the moneys they handle are not their..... this point ought to be made strongly to our chaps. Our chaps must be prepared to take drastic action to forestall any discrimination against us which might be evident.
 - d). Mrs Nzo has been in touch with us urgently requesting money in view of a critical position she faces. Shortly before we received a message from Bzo appealing to us to help in view of the fact that he can't take out money from Cairo. What we thought could be the way out is for Nzo to pay into our Cairo office a certain sum and Dar could then put out the same amount in sterling to be available to his wife. For the time being we have sent 10 pounds from here to her.
 - e) Duma has up to now not contacted me about certain work to do here.
