Re: OFFICE BUDGET

On the 5th November, 1991 the delegation of ANC Chancery headed by the Chief Representative Mr. Baba Schalk met with the Swedish Embassy headed by its Ambassador, Mr. Sten Rylander in order to review the needs and budget of ANC Chancery in Windhoek in preparation of the oncoming SIDA-ANC talks on financial assistance.

After an extensive discussion, both parties agreed that there is an urgency to increase the budget allocation for our Windhoek Chancery. The reason being the following:-

STATUS OF THE CHANCERY.

The ANC Chancery has been accorded diplomatic status and therefore it must operate and compete with other missions accredited to the Republic of Namibia as far as the effectiveness and efficiency of the tasks to be performed. Therefore it must be provided with necessary facilities to realise its objectives.

IMPORTANCE OF THE WINDHOEK CHANCERY

This office is important and vital for the organisation in many ways besides the usual political and diplomatic representation. The other tasks is to study the pre and post independence of Namibia. So far our Chancery have organised seminars, conferences and training of ANC personnel from South Africa in various aspects, including a conference on legal and constitutional matters; training on local government and diplomacy; and the whole process of reorganisation and reconstruction of the economy and the whole government machinery of a newly independent country. There are many other activities of this nature that are in the pipe-line including a seminar on voter's education and elections.
