C) The strategy of the African National Congress (ANC) seems to be

paying dividends. The internationalisation of the conflict in South Africa has long been the goal of the leaders of the

organisation, especially after they were able to watch from close quarters how the involvement of the UN has brought power to their marxist friends in SWA/Namibia (SWAPO) and Rhodesia (ZANU). ANC President Nelson Mandela has demanded at least 400 UNO observers

in South Africa to support the peace process, and monitor and prevent acts of violence. The ANC/Communist alliance realises that, in a free and fair election, it is far from certain that it could count on the support of the greater majority of the Black!
