On the 18th of January 1983 a Youth delegation left for Algeria. The delegation was composed of cdes Mkhize, Mongezi and Roller.

The main purpose of the trip was to revitalise our relationship with UNJA, the Youth of Algeria. The main purpose was achieved. The protocol agreement was signed on the 26th of January 1983 in Algiers.

When it comes to material aid the emphasis was laid on propaganda assistance! The Youth delegation was taken to UNJA'S printing press for sight seeing. We then took advantage of the facilities since it has been the decision<sup>of</sup> the Youth Secretariat to produce brochus of the conference. Broader questions concerning the propaganda of the Youth section were discussed. UNJA agreed to offer any kind of assistance when it comes to our propaganda. They also offered producing T. Shirts for this purpose.

The question of training our cadres for journalism was discussed and agreed upon. Related to this was the question of sanitary facilities. We thought we should use this opportunity to send our cadres to Algeria for rest or medical treatment purposes. This suggestion was accepted but, we were told to write an application to this effect so that a decision could be taken on a higher level.

Also raised was the question of passports. These could also be supplied depending on the follow up from a higher level.

The delegation used it's presence in Algeria to meet the Rencontre et Development CCSA. We had an informal meeting with this group. Our discussion was mainly based on the political situation in South Africa. We discovered that infact this group was supporting the movement nationally but, mainly SOMAFECO.

We impressed upon this group about the shortage of soap, toothpaste and first aid medicul aquipment<sup>in ANGOLA</sup>. The Rencontre agreed to raise the mentioned items from their emergency fund. We were able therefore to take with us a box of soap (Washing and toilet ), packets of elastoplast, bandages, few litres of mercury crome and cotton wool. These were delivered to the logistics department in Angola.

It is clear from the report that our trip to Algiers was a success. Most of the decisions have to be implemented as soon as possible as ellaborated in the bilaterals. Some agreements has to be reached that infact the sub-committee should undertake a special trip to various countries specifically to solicit funds from various Youth Organisations. That this effort should be intensiffied in order to realise the envisaged programme.
