These will be mailed and charged automatically.

Standing orders may also be placed for material on a specific subject, e.g. education, labour, homelands etc. Relevant material will be mailed and charged as it appears.

All publications subscriptions ensure that subscribers receive copies of each new publication of the Institute as it appears. The cost is: Southern Africa – R50 per annum (\$50 US or £25 UK) and R60 elsewhere.

### 2. Membership of the Institute
