The direct link between the consumption of pornography and the heinous crimes of serial killers has been clearly and repeatedly established. American serial killer Ted Bundy declared in an interview given on the night before his execution (for murdering over 30 women and girls) that pornography was the common factor between all the serial killers and violent criminals that he had come into contact with during his eight years in jail. â\200\231

And Bundy warned that the pornography that had led him on the addictive path to mass murder was mild compared to the material now available.

According to a 1985 FBI study in -which jailed serial killers were interviewed, 81% reported that their biggest interest was in pornography. Mass murderer and cannibal Jeffrey Dahmer -enticed his victims to his -apartment by inviting them to watch

pornographic videos. When police searched Dahmer's apartment they found pornographic tapes strewn about the room, and pictures of naked men in various stages of dismemberment were displayed on the freezer in which skulls were found.

Why then do we as a society, and our government, tolerate the publication and sale of pornography, knowing that it contributes to the devastating social and criminal problems in our country?

The answer is that we have all been duped by a blatant lie, namely that publication of pornography is a form of freedom of expression and that the purchase of pornography is an exercise of freedom of choice. Nothing could be further from the truth. The great principles of freedom of expression and freedom of choice are fundamental to a democratic society, and must be protected at all costs.

Pornography is the unscrupulous,

unconscionable and abusive exploitation of these good principles for the purpose of making easy money. No

freedoms are absolute: all freedoms have limits. We cannot and we must not allow the good provisions of our great new constitution to be abused to channel filth to our people by unscrupulous, money-grabbing enemies of decency and morality, who in the process corrupt our youth, and subject our children and women to degradation and sexual violence.

In the words of Martin Luther King: â\200\234Thank God Almighty, we are free at last.â\200\235 But beware that the achievement of freedom does not lead to the enslavement of our people by the evil tyranny of pornography.

The book The Case Against Pornography says: â\200\234The movement to legalise pornography is one with the movement to legalise drugs â\200\224 and for motives that have little in common with John Stuart Mill's eloquent plea for liberty.â\200\235 It adds: â\200\234The last word must be with Plato. a man who

was more fearful of corruption through freedom than through tyrannical

tyranny".

David Mullany, editor of Scope, maintains in â\200\234Student Lifeâ\200\235 that one cannot speak of freedom of speech and outlaw hate or racist speech. â\200\234If

really hurt. One should be free to advocate child porn and pederasty.â\200\235 Pornographic lines in South

Africa publish photographs and materials imported from the US and other countries. South African money pays for these pornographic materials. In this way the production and sale of pornography is an insidious way of extracting money from South African citizens and transferring it into the pockets of organised crime bosses in other countries.

Pornography is a R70-billion industry worldwide, which is 85% controlled by organised crime. (It is

these same crime bosses that control -

the international drugs trade which
is currently flooding our country with

cocaine, crack, heroin, etc.)
We must be vigilant not to be
duped by those who advocate, as a
solution to the problem, the sale of
pornography only in sex shops,
wrapped in plastic folders, only to
persons over 18, etc. Such measures
will prove to be totally ineffective.
Vulnerable and inquisitive children
will still get their hands on pornogra-
phic magazines and videos. Paedo-
philes, rapists, sexual abusers of
children, and serial killers, who have
an insatiable and lascivious appetite
for pornography as a sexual stimu-
lant and as instruction manuals for
their heinous crimes, will easily ob-
tain all the pornography they need. ;
