In 1961, Mandela called for a dialogue with the white

South African government, but cowards that they are, Verwoerd and his
then Minister of Justice, Vorster, decided to imprison Mandela for life.

For over three hundred years, Black South Africa has resisted and
is still fighting tooth and nail, the divide and rule policies of
white South Africa. They resist also this latest manifestation of that
white policy, the dialogue ruse, which is designed to divide and weaken
Africa.

Let Malawi, Ghana and others be Warned not to fall into this trap, a trap that will set black against black and create agents of Vorster in the very bosom of independent Africa. In this Vorster is not alone. He has as a co-conspirator Heath, who had deceived the Commonwealth, Africa and the worldo They both act in the interests of the reactionary clique of the NATO block and Japan, which aims to keep Africa under its heel.

Vorster " will be sending out formal invitations to leaders of ceratin Black states to visit South Africa for discussions aimed at easing blackpwhite tensions on the African continento " Yet Vorster despises Black South Africans. How can he speak to Banda, when he does not want even to see the shadow of Nelson Mandela?

Dialogue between Vorster and any African President or Prime

Minister will be viewed by the Black South African masses as an act hostile not only to their own struggle for liberation, but also to the further unfolding of the continuing African Revolution. Vorster's friends, wherever they may he, cannot be but enemies of the peoi¬\2011es of Africa;

The Black masses of South Africa will do their duty in dislodging and driving the white oppressors from their country. They ask the world's progressive forces to do their duty in isolating the white fascists.

The soâ\200\224called Bantustans are arid areas reserved for Africans. The 3,800,000 whites own 87 per cent of our land, which land is the most fertile and industrialised, while the 18 million blacks are confined to the remaining 13 per cent, which is unproductive and not industrialised.

The South African apartheid system is based on white supremacy and black inferiority. White South Africa fervently and even blindly believes that the  $\dots$  /3

believes that the Blacks are by God's decree hewers of wood and drawers of water. How then will Bands and the others convince such fanatics?

During the early years of Black resistance against white invasion, the Boer strategy was letting Black fight against Black, soâ\200\224called tribes against each other. At present, what is Vorster's strategem? Of course, to him, the Blacks have always been inferior, hence they cannot learn from the past. First, he must divide and rule them at home. Hence the perfidious policy of creating Bantustans. Although his Xhosastan of the Transkei has failed dismally, and his Zulustan is crumbling, he, still, is trying further to bluff the world by creating a Tswanastan.

Second, he must divide and later rule the African states to the North of him. He wants to set progressive Africa, headed by Presidents Keunda, Nyerere, Tours and others at loggerheads with Banda, Tsiranane, Houphouetâ\200\224Boigny, Busia and others â\200\224 and in the meantime himself concentrate on the destruction of the liberation movement in South and Southern Africa and reâ\200\224colonising independent Africa.

Judases like Banda and Tsiranana have sold their people into slavery, as cheap labour for the mines, farms and white kitchens of South Africa for K8,000,000 and K2,320,000 respectively. This is the type of dialogue white South Africa wants.

The African National Congress of South Africa calls on Africa to dismiss any dialogue with racist South Africa as a trick and a fraud.

As for our struggling people, they have no need for a dialogue with Vorster. Nor do they need a black emissary to visit VorSter from independent Africa, to beg him to free the black South African masses. Black South hfrica will free itself, using methods that it only can choose.
