so you can see what the copy is as we have finally worked it out. This actually is quite similar to the mimeographed copy which I showed you when you were here in April.

It would be very helpful if you could drop me a note listing the names and addresses of persons you think especially ought to be invited to sign this appeal. I am thinking of people on the British scene and also anyone in Africa or in Asia that you think of.

I am sure you can think of some of the more important persons that ought to be invited that may not occur to us here.

The letter in-

volving people to become signers will be signed by Chief Luthuli and Martin Luther King.

Perhaps Mrs. Roosevelt will be added if I can reach her.

We are anxious to proceed with this as soon as possible because the sooner we have the final appeal with the signers, and therefore have the final brochure printed, the sooner we can begin our active organizational work.

I hope to hear from you soon, and high that everything is

going well.
