NEDBANK ARTS ALIVE AFRICAN SANCTUS AND MISSA LUBA

Presented by Nedbank and Arts Alive, this first performance of the Arts Alive Festival is a stirring production to be performed in an unusual setting. The SABC Choir and Chamber Choir are conducted by Richard Cock in this production of David Fanshawe's musical journey through Africa. Musical accompaniment includes the Alexandra drummers, percussion musicians and pianist Surendran Reddy. Renette Bouwer sings the extremely taxing soloist part. Fanshawe travelled through various countries in Africa, researching and collecting musical sounds, sounds typical to the area (he even uses a recording of rain and frogs in one section of the Sanctus). These recordings are blended with the choral and instrumental music, creating a fascinating masterpiece of African sounds. African Sanctus is presented with the Missa Luba, an elegant African mass arranged by Guido Haazen.
