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SUMMARY RECORDS

The annual consultations between the Government of Finland and the African National Congress were held in Lusaka on February 14th and 15th, 1990.

The Finnish delegation was headed by Ms. Armi Heinonen, Deputy Director General, Ministry for Foreign Affairs of Finland.- The ANC delegation was headed by Mr. Kay Moonsamy, Head of Finance, Treasury, the African National Congress.

1 .GENERAL . .

On the day prior to the opening of the Annual Consultations, Mr. T. Nkobi, Treasurer General of the ANC paid a visit on the Ambassador and the delegation from Finland. He explained that despite the fact that significant developments were taking place inside South Africa, there was still a need for development assistance. He drew a parallel

In his opening remarks Mr. Kay Moonsamy, head of the ANC delegation, expressed the ANC's appreciation of the continued humanitarian assistance from Finland and said that although the southern Africa region, politically it can be considered a Frontline State. 2.1: EDUCATION SECTOR

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d.1.1.1. LIBRARY PROJECT

The library.project in Mazimbu and Dakawa operated in accordance with the plan. Most of the funds were used for material deliveries for vocational training of the personnel, for scholarships and costs incurred by the Finnish Library Association. t

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The allocation for the project was FIM 1.6 million of which FIM 453.669 will be transferred to the _ ,1 year 1990.' , /

The current phase of the ongoing library project covers the period July 1st, 1989 - December 31st, 1990. It was agreed that the planning of the next phase should be started as soon as possible.

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It was agreed that the Finnish Library Association will be asked to be in charge of planning the next project phase, which covers the years 1991 - 1993.

ANC stressed the importance of construction of a library in Dakawa., ANC would ask the Finnish Library Association to employ a consultant to prepare preliminary plans for the library. Technical assistance for this purpose will be provided as indicated in the budget.

It was agreed that the allocation for the library project for the year 1990 budget is FIM 959.600.00. The carry over from the previous year is FIM 450.000,00. Thus the total funding will be SIM 1.400.000,00. '

1990. This report was recognized as forming an
important basis for the future planning of the
educational sector and some of its recommendations
were already being implemented.

It was decided that FINNIDA will look into the

VTC Luthuli Cultural and Welfare Services (LCWS)
was mentioned as one possibility. The ANC
delegation promised to furnish FINNIDA with
additional information on the LCWS.

It was agreed that one curriculum and one
administrative adviser will be recruited in the
course of 1990.

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A list of educational and extracurricular material
needs for the Centre will be submitted by ANC
to FINNIDA.

2.2. HEALTH SECTOR

3.MATERIAL ASSISTANCE

The material assistance during the year 1989 consisted mainly of basic foodstuffs. Most of the items were bought and forwarded from Finland and some goods are still on the way. The allocation for material deliveries for the year 1989 was FIM 1.156.000,09 and the carry over from the previous year was FIM 1.035. 000.

ANC submitted a list of 'daily necessities for FINNIDA'S consideration. It was agreed that ANC H141. ach..i'-'a giuuhaj-Utlb for Locally available ILEIHS and FINNIDA for items available in Finland. The .1131 will be returned to ANC for approval. / i.

The allocation for 1990 for daily necessities is indicated in the budget. '

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The second component of material assistance is building activity. 4The construction of the Lusaka warehouse is currently proceeding and the building will be ready in a few months.

The allocation for the building of the warehouse was FIM 700. 000,00

It was agreed that the SLm carried over from the 1989 allocation will be used for outstanding payments and the security arrangements and ,equipping the warehouse. ANC will present a cost estimate and any necessary adjustments will be discussed at the review-meeting.
