We wish to draw your attention to a very important decision taken by the Algerian authorities and being rigorously implemented from the 1st January, 1972.


As from this date all applications for passports or renewals are to be submitted at the Algerian embassies where the comrades are based. And should there be no embassy where the applicant resides, contact should be made with the nearest embassy, using, of course, our representatives.

It is argued that this is intended to facilitate matters for both the Algerian government and ourselves. And, of course, it affects all movements and revolutionary parties based here or recognised by Algeria. Saving time and money is ~~saving~~ one of the reasons given for the decision.

In practice this means that from now henceforth, applications authorised by our Headquarters or the Presidency as ~~xxx~~ agreed upon a year or so ago should be forwarded to the Embassy. The Embassy then forwards these to the Presidency here whereupon we are consulted to ratify. This done, the document is then made available to the applicant by the Embassy concerned.

For comrades based elsewhere such as London, they directly contact the London Embassy. We would like to advise strict adherence to this arrangement if we are to avoid frustrating delays and disappointments.
