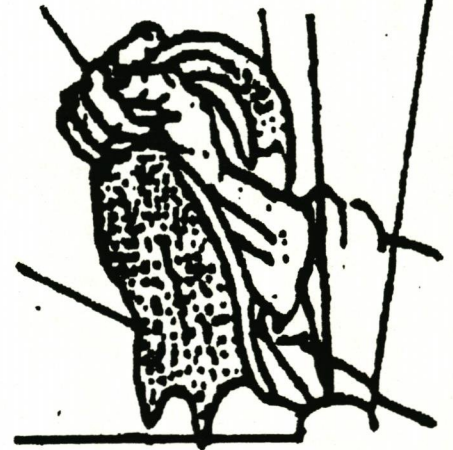

The Honourable *Chairman*

Contralesa is aware of a memorandum that has been sent to all Homeland Administrations. We are aware that you have been asked to co-ordinate delegates of traditional leaders from various provinces to attend the planning conference. Contralesa is concerned about the short notice which these administrations have been given. No person can be able to co-ordinate a meeting of all traditional leaders in any province in such a short space of time. It boils down to a situation where homeland administration will have to appoint traditional leaders to attend the planning conference without the mandate of traditional leaders in all four (4) provinces.

Contralesa suggests the following mechanism in order to have a proper representative delegation to the Multi-Party Conference or Codesa.

1. Meetings that are to be held provincially to elect delegates of traditional leaders should be co-ordinated by Contralesa and ( Contralesa ) be assisted by homeland administrations as per suggestion by Multi-Party Planning Conference.
2. We suggest these meetings should be chaired by multi-party/ Codesa officials. If this is not acceptable, we suggest the meeting to be chaired by U.N/OAU/COMMON WEALTH Observer Mission

Contralesa is suggesting the above proposals to ensure that delegates that attend negotiations are democratically elected by all traditional leaders themselves.

One point we suggest should be noted is the size of the TRANSVAAL. TVL consist of six (6) different homelands and therefore cannot be equated to other provinces who have one or two homelands.

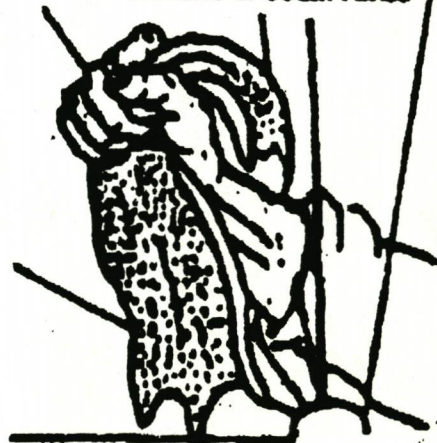

#### YOUR REPRESENTATIONS

By direction of Mr Roelf Meyer, Minister of Constitutional Development and of Communication, I acknowledge receipt of your letter dated 9 December 1992.

Dear Sir/s,

We wish to record our objection and dismay at your decision not to allow electronic recordings during the opening statements at the start of today's planning conference for the resumption of multi-party talks. The reason given for your decision, that you do not wish to accord too high a profile to the planning conference and therefore do not wish to allow live coverage of the proceedings, seems to miss the point. At no stage did we intend to give live television or radio coverage to the planning conference. It is however, our contention that in the interest of better news coverage we should be allowed to record at least the opening statements and the resolution if any is reached, and that the process of news selection will in any case ensure that "too high a profile" will be avoided-but that what is broadcast will be the best coverage possible. We feel that in this time when politicians across the spectrum are calling for reduced interference in the electronic media and the S.A.B.C. in particular, we will have lost an opportunity to give South Africans the best possible coverage but without the "grand-standing" attendant on any live broadcast.
