A commodity trader familiar with African mineral trade remarked that Uganda had been exporting relatively large amounts of gold and diamonds. Uganda has no diamond and only limited gold deposits of its own.

DRC authorities at the beginning of November 1998 complained to the Zimbabwean

Ministry of Industry and Commerce that some Zimbabwean companies operating in the DRC are defrauding their DRC counterparts. This mainly takes the form of Zimbabwean companies taking collecting orders from their DRC counterparts, getting advance

payments and then failing to deliver. Some of the companies include MACH-MELEAN (suppliers of sugar), ZIMSOLAR (suppliers of solar panels), Tedman Printers, Swift Investments (supplier of foodstuffs) and Native Investments. The Zimbabwe government is continuously urging private companies to get involved in the DRC while the market is unfavourable. The Ministry of Industry and Commerce was therefore advised to consider the appointment of a trade attaché to the DRC, who could assist DRC companies in trading only with reputable Zimbabwean companies.

To date, Burundi's approach to the DRC conflict was mainly focussed on securing its border area against Hutu extremist attacks. With increasing reports of Hutu extremists joining the KABILA forces, the Burundi government will probably be forced to change its

DRC Minister of state in the Presidency, Victor MPOYO recently stated that the optimism that existed after Angola had sent a large motorized infantry unit to the Kasai provinces of the DRC has waned, after it became clear that the Angolans have sent their least effective troops and that the MIG-21 aircraft provided are barely serviceable. The Commander of the Angolan Air Force has indicated that he would not deploy front line aircraft in the east of the DRC as losses from anti-aircraft missiles are feared. MPOYO also indicated that the Zimbabwean Minister of Justice, Emmerson MNANGAGWA, is pressurizing President KABILA to pay Zimbabwe a sum of US\$500 million before the end of December 1998. According to him MNANGAGWA has hinted that a continued Zimbabwean troop presence in the DRC could be linked to the payment of the US\$500 million. MPOYO, pointed out that the DRC government has effectively run out of money, as it has to buy rations for the Congolese Armed Forces (FAC) on six months credit terms.

President KABILA in Kinshasa and Katanga.

the RCD executive, Bizima KARAHYA, was apparently under orders to infiltrate the DRC

presidency and the PAC. He was also to gather strategic information on how to capture the DRC

capital militarily. KABAGAME was apparently found with sophisticated communication devices,

arms and ammunition at his residence. It is also alleged that KABAGAME was using the Second

Secretary at the Ugandan embassy in Kinshasa to forward information to the Ugandan authorities.
