DRC authorities at the beginning of November 1998 complained to the Zimbabwean

Ministry of Industry and Commerce that some Zimbabwean companies operating in the DRC are defrauding their DRC counterparts. This mainly takes the form of Zimbabwean companies taking collecting orders from their DRC counterparts, getting advance SECRET

payments and then failing to deliver. Some of the companies include MACH-MELEAN (suppliers of sugar), ZIMSOLAR (suppliers of solar panels), Tedman Printers, Swift Investments (supplier of foodstuffs) and Native Investments. The Zimbabwe government is continuously urging private companies to get involved in the DRC while the market isfavourable. The Ministry of Industry and Commerce was therefore advised to consider the appointment of a trade attaché to the DRC, who could assist DRC companies in trading only with reputable Zimbabwean companies.

December 1998. According to him MNANGAGWA has hinted that a continued Zimbabwean troop presence in the DRC could be linked to the payment of the US\$500 million. MPOYO, pointed out that the DRC government has eï¬\202ectively run out ofmoney, as it has to buy rations

for the Congolese Armed Forces (FAC) on six months credit terms.
