The Chancellor

 $\hat{a}\200\234$ Chancellor $\hat{a}\200\235$ is an office that goes back to antiquity: the original Chancel lor or cancellarius (as the office

was known) regulated access to the Roman Tribune. In medieval times, the office became asso ciated with

the heads of the writing departments of the early kings. Because so few people were literat e, a chancellor

was necessarily learned. This is why the heads and spokepersons of the early universities w ere also accorded

the title. More recently, the office has become largely symbolic. The executive head of a university is its

vice-chancellor.

Justice Pius Langa is the sixth Chancellor of the University of Natal. His predecessors are : The Honourable

D G Shepstone (1949-1966), Dr G G Campbell (1967-1973), Dr B A Armitage (1973-1983), the Ho nourable

R N Leon QC (1983-1992), and Archbishop D E Hurley (1993-1998).

The Mace

The Chancellorâ\200\231s Mace is used on ceremonial occasions presided over by the Chancell or and is regarded as

the Chancellorâ\200\231s â\200\234staff of officeâ\200\235. It symbolises the Universityâ \200\231s protection of its Chancellor.

The use of the mace as a symbol of authority has a long history. The head of a copper mace, which

apparently dates back to the 12" Century before Christ, has been excavated at Beyce Sultan in Asia. In the

early centuries, churchmen who went to war often carried a mace in preference to a sword. One side of the

mace-head was beautifully decorated with the owner \hat{a} 00\231s emblem and on the other side w as a large knob which

served as a weapon, but was always round as a reminder of church law forbidding the sheddin ${\sf g}$ of blood. In

the early centuries the mace was a symbol of the king $\hat{a}\200\231s$ authority. During the power struggle between the

king and the Commons in the 13" Century, the king gave the speaker the mace as a symbol of his indemnity $\dot{}$

against arrest.

The Mace was designed by Mr G H Atkins, senior lecturer in sculpture in the University \hat{a} Department of

Fine Arts. The Mace was made in England, it was first used at the 1970 graduation ceremonie s.

The Armorial Bearings (see front cover)

The armorial bearings of the University of Natal were awarded by the College of Arms in London..

The two black wildebeest come from the arms of the Province of KwaZulu-Natal. They are show n in full

course to symbolise movement and progress. The two open books represent the universal herit age of

knowledge and the two centres of the University, Durban and Pietermaritzburg. The five poin ted star refers

to the naming of Natal by Portuguese navigators when they landed for the first time at Durb an on $\operatorname{Christmas}$

Day in 1497. Stella Aurorae (star of the dawn) symbolises the role of the University in bringing to light new

knowledge and spreading the enlightening influence of education.

Academic Dress

The wearing of gowns by judges, ministers, teachers and scholars is an ancient and signific

ant custom.

When the graduating students at universities receive their diplomas or degrees, they, too (and for some, only

once in their lives) wear the caps and gowns and so participate in this long tradition. By wearing the ancient

regalia, they join hands with students past and students present.

In modern academic ceremonies the standard cap and gown are almost universally worn. Of all the

components of the costume, the hood conveys the greatest amount of information: it makes clear the level of

the degree, the faculty in which it was given, and the institution which awarded it.

Convocation

After being capped by the Chancellor, each graduate moves across the stage and hands the ho od to the

President of Convocation (or representative). The President places the hood upon the gradua $te\hat{a}200\231s$ shoulders.

At the end of the ceremony, after the Chancellorâ $\200\231s$ procession has left the stage, the President leads a

procession of the new graduates out of the hall, row by row, to symbolise their acceptance into, and future

membership of, the Convocation of the University of Natal, the statutory body through which graduates have

the opportunity to play a continuing role in the affairs of the University.

SHISHUPAL RAMBHAROS

The human being we are honouring today was born 80 years ago in Richmond, Natal. The life experiences of

Shishupal Rambharos span the complexities of the last century of South African, and indeed world history.

He has seen both the enormous pain and suffering of this past century and been part of some of its great

humanity and success. The 1900s was the stage $\frac{200}{224}$ in this province and across the plane $\frac{200}{224}$ for great battles

over colonial rule; ethnic and racial segregation; fascism; the fight for women to gain equality with men; the

system of Apartheid and its demise; the varieties of capitalist and socialist state systems battling over

definitions and systems of the good life; spiritual and material debates; and a massive exp ansion of both

scientific and technical knowledge and definitions of human rights and freedoms.

A man of this province, the son of an indentured labourer who arrived in Natal in 1895, and an invalid

mother, Shishupal Rambharos was orphaned at an early age. From the age of six until his early adulthood,

 $\hat{a}\200\234home \hat{a}\200\235for\ Mr\ Rambharos\ was\ an\ old\ age\ institution,\ where\ he\ lived\ with\ the\ aged\ and\ infirm,\ in\ conditions$

in fact totally unsuitable for a small developing person. This institution, the Aryan Benev olent Home, had

been set up by the generation before his father \hat{a} 00\231s: by other survivors of indentured servitude from South East

Asia, who had sweated into the soil of this coastal province and eked out several instituti ons built on faith

and commitment to their communities and this region.

Over the course of his life time Mr Rabharos has dedicated all his efforts towards developing the institutions

and networks of civil society $\hat{a}\200\224$ in the areas of community service and development; ed ucation and cultural

learning; in the realm of child welfare; and in the search for spiritual knowledge and trut h. We might all

agree that these kinds of institutions (orphanages, community-supported homes for the elder ly; publicly

supported schools; cultural development in community halls), are the bedrock of survival an d dignity for the

poor. But Mr Rambharos would see these as the foundation for all sectors of society, as vit al to the poor as to

the richâ\200\224in fact the only measure of true wealth.

While Mr Rambharos was born into poverty and seemed doomed to a life of sweated labour, his educational

profile by the end of the 1950s was remarkable and could have afforded him a life of self-f ocus and

monetary enrichment even under the constraints of Apartheid. But this is a man who measures human wealth

in its broadest terms. Armed with these entrees into professional circles, Mr Rambharos ins tead dedicated his

efforts to open up doors for generations of people both younger and older than himself.

It is most fitting that Mr Rambharos is being honoured before an audience of graduates toda y as one of the

most powerful elements of his life-narrative has been his commitment to life-long learning and education

across a number of formal fields. Starting out as a clerk, and working his way through book eeping and

teaching certificates and diplomas, he was determined first to gain a high-school education

; then a teacher \hat{a} 200\231s

qualification; and then eventually a Bachelor of Commerce through this University. While he has

concentrated his efforts on the elderly, developing the Aryan Benevolent Home into a large nationally known

institution in Chatsworth which is now named after him, he has left his imprint on almost v ery sector of this

regionâ\200\231s social frabric, and even started institutions is the Cape and Gauteng.

Professor Fatima Meer wrote in 1999:

In my estimation, Shishupal Rambharos is a rare South African, almost saint-like in his hum anitarian

calling. In my experience only one other $a\200\234$ Natalian $a\200\235$ matches his humility, h is dedication and his

commitment to fellow human beings and that is Archbihop Hurley.

Mr Rambharos has been recognised for his work with decorations, awards, and honours from many sectors

of society, but not our University. Today we join together with the people of this region in honouring him.

A Brief History of the University of Natal

Natal University College - The forerunner of the University of Natal - opened it's doors in Pietermaritzburg in 1910 with

eight professors and 57 students, eight of whom were women. Lectures in Classics, English a nd Philosophy, Law,

Modern Languages, Botany and Geology, Chemistry and Physics, Mathematics and Zoology were s pread over various

venues, including Maritzburg College, the Natal Museum building and at the City Hall.

It was not until August 1912 that Old Main Building - built on 40 acres of land donated by the Pietermaritzburg

Corporation - was opened by the then Minister of Education, F.S. Malan and the core of the present-day Pietermaritzburg

campus was established. The following year, Natal University College (NUC) ceased to be a state institution, becoming

instead a state-aided body.

In 1923, NUC extended its tuition to Durban with university level courses in Commerce and E ngineering at the Technical

College, but it was not until 1928 that Durban agreed that NUC take over full responsibility for university classes in

Durban, thereby establishing the characteristic dual nature of the University of Natal. A g enerous donation by T $\rm B$

Davis, whose son, Howard Davis had been killed during the battle of the Somme in World War I, facilitated the building

of Howard College on the Berea which formed the core of a separate campus in Durban. Howard College was formally opened in 1931.

Largely through the efforts of Fabian Socialist Dr Mabel Palmer, separate classes for 19 "N on-European" teaching

students at NUC were introduced in Durban in 1936. This number, reflecting an obvious need for training of this nature,

grew to nearly 900 by 1960. However, like the University's Medical School, founded in 1951 for black students, classes

still reflected the segregated nature of South Africa under apartheid. The government's Ext ension of University Act of

1959 limited new enrolments, other than those at Medical School, to whites and thwarted the University's aspirations

to serve the educational needs of broader society. This act also restricted the autonomy ac hieved when NUC was granted

full university status in 1949. It was not until 1983 when the University circumvented the government's racial admission

"quotas" by an appeal to the High Court, that the University could fully resume its role of serving the educational needs

of the broader community. Today, about 20 000 students, representing all sectors of South A frican society, are enrolled at the University of Natal.

In 1953, the administrative control for the University was shifted from Pietermaritzburg to Durban. In response to

mounting travelling costs, the two centres were academically separated in 1973, with each c entre having parallel faculties

of Law, Humanities, Commerce, Science, and Social Science. Recent restructuring has meant the merging of some

faculties across both campuses, with Faculties of Engineering, and Law being shared by both campuses. Unique to

Durban are the Faculties of Community and Development Disciplines, Management Studies, Scie nce and Medicine.

Unique to Pietermaritzburg is the Science and Agriculture Faculty. There are separate Faculties of Human Sciences on each campus.

The University of Natal is fortunate to boast among its past vice-chancellors and principal s some exceptional leaders.

Its first principal, John Bews (1930-38), was a world-renowned botanist while Dr E G Malher be (1945-65) was known

internationally as an educationalist. In 1993, the University of Natal was the first South

African University to appoint

a woman as its principal. Brenda Gourley is the present incumbent. Chancellors have also be en distinguished figures,

not least the present Chancellor, Judge Pius Langa, and the recently retired Archbishop Den is Hurley. Students include

Alan Paton, Steve Biko and Alec Erwin. Honorary graduates include Nelson Mandela, Roy Campb ell and Abdullah

Ebrahim.

The University of Natal is committed to service through excellence in teaching and research and is opposed to

discrimination on the grounds of race, colour, nationality, religion or gender. It is known as a centre for excellence in

Africa, is one of South Africa's top research institutions, and has links with almost 260 i nternational institutions. Alive

to the demands of a rapidly changing global environment, the University has embarked on a t horough reform of curricula

and university structures and is currently a leader in multi-disciplinary studies and is en gaged in significant ${\rm HIV/Aids}$

research. In recognition of its role in society, the University of Natal is also committed to greater emphasis on

community-based education and service learning.
