Dear Friends,

Further to the press release we faxed to you on the 22nd February we have now received, from the Office of the President of the European Parliament, the official text of the resolution which was adopted last week.

You will be pleased to see that it contains many of the amendments which the Liaison Group meeting in Brussels proposed should be made in relation to Namibia, Angola and South Africa. Please note in particular the positions which it takes regarding the removal of the obstacles to negotiations, the Constituent Assembly and the Interim Government.

We are now planning to seek a meeting with Jacques Poos. We will keep you informed of any initiatives taken in this area, either by ourselves or by the ANC.

Finally you may be interested in the enclosed documents:

- 1) A memorandum from the British Anti-Apartheid Movement to the Special Session of the Commonwealth Committee of Foreign Ministers on Southern Africa, which met in London on the 16th February
- 2) A memorandum from SATIS (South Africa - The Imprisoned Society) to the above meeting of the Commonwealth Committee
- 3) ANC Statement from the 15th February and report from the Working Party established under paragraph 3 of the Pretoria Minute
