fore talks yesterday. Mr De Klerlt said the govern-
ment wished to create the right climate for negotia-
ttom by eliminating obstacles "u soon a possible"
and wu consequently approaching the talks "with
the utmost earnestness".

The government was entering the taltts "profound-
ly aware or our responsibilities to all the people ot
South Africa".

Mr De Klerk said the meetmg provtded another

process" of normalising South African politics "We
will seile that opportunity "
