Above all, with the firm conviction that providing greater educational chances for their children is one of the crucial keys to the future South Africa, Mandela and other ANC leaders have been a sking many countries of the world for their financial support. In June 1990, with a fervent wish to support those Africans, we started our organization, "The People's Education Support Fund, Japan". Thus economic poverty and social discrimination have long de prived African children of the fundamental right to education. According to a survey, 1,500,000 children of school age are said to be looking for chances and places of study. To help provide chances of study for more and more African child ren, "The People's Educa tion Support Fund, Japan" has begun the following project.
