DEAR COMRADE PRESIDENT

RE: COMPLAINT ON SCHOOL

I am a student in the GDR, doing what was supposed to be Medical Assistance. I am writing this letter to launch a complaint direct to you, having tried all the possible channels in the ANC to solve my problem. My problem is to be allowed to further my studies by doing Medical Technic or Med. Pedagogic. If our course was qualitative, this side, I could terminate

my studies. Having evaluated our course we found no difference between it and nursing if not beyond.

To my surprise I have received a letter from our Chief Representative stating that the Deputy Head of our Health Department is instructing me to go back to Angola as soon as possible. What worries me is that the comrade does not know me and doesn't know what I am studying and doesn't know my performance in my studies but instructs me to go back to Angola as soon as possible. What have I done in the organization that I don't get a chance to study, meanwhile other people I am studying with are given chances to further their studies.

Now my question is that what ~~and~~ a change or miracle am I going to perform in Angola being alone, whilst there is a critical shortage of personnel? If one can ask me what have I learned in this Department for the past eight years, there is nothing I have learned

except begging people to allow me to study.
That is not supposed to be the case in
the ANC, for education is a right not a privilege.
Through you comrade President, I am asking
to be given a chance to study, so that I
can be in the position of serving our people
with adequate knowledge for the interests of
our revolution.
