RE: MR. TUNDE HARRISON. NIGERIAN JOURNALIST.

The above-named is a Nigerian journalist who has been in Harare for about three months now. Prior to Tunde's arrival in Zimbabwe, the Foreign Minister of the Government of Zimbabwe had recommended him to me.

Tunde Harrison is the Special Correspondent of the New Nigerian Newspaper Press Ltd., for East and Southern Africa. I have on ~~three~~ occasions had in-depth discussions with him about the ANC'S perspective on the struggle for national and economic liberation in South Africa. He has to me expressed the view that the Nigerian mass media do not adequately portray the ANC position on issues. He therefore feels motivated to play his professional part in this context.

He wishes to travel to South Africa for a "closer look at the ANC". He faces a problem in that the Pretoria regime, through its Trade Mission in Harare, is not immediately forthcoming on his request for an entry visa into South Africa. He has approached me to ask if the ANC in South Africa could help so that his desire could materialise.

I hope to hear from you at your earliest convenience on this matter.
