PRESS RELEASE - INTEREST - ACADEMIC HONOURS



1985 HONORARY DEGREES

Two Honorary degrees will be conferred by the University of Natal at Graduation ceremonies to be held in Durban in 1985.

On Thursday, 2nd May, the degree of Doctor of Engineering will be conferred upon Dr Louw Alberts, Director General of the Department of Mineral and Energy Affairs and President of the Council for Mineral Technology (MINTEK). On Friday, 3rd May eminent Pathologist and Medical Researcher, Dr James Henderson Sutherland Gear, will receive the Honorary degree of Doctor of Medicine.

<u>Dr Louw Alberts</u> is to be honoured by the University for his inspired leadership in matters concerning the mineral wealth of South Africa. He has played a major international role in the strategic energy affairs of the Republic, and his contributions to science have been outstanding, particularly in the field of mineral technology.

Born and educated in Port Elizabeth, Dr Alberts is a graduate of Rhodes University, where he was awarded the B.Sc. degree and a Masters degree in Physics. As a Lecturer in Physics he took a temporary post at the University of Natal, leaving in 1946 to join the University of the Orange Free State, where he was awarded the D.Sc. degree in 1952 and where he subsequently was appointed Professor and Head of the Department of Physics in 1962. During this period, Dr Alberts also studied overseas in Amsterdam, Holland and at Sheffield, England. He became Professor of Physics at the Rand Afrikaans University in 1968.

In 1971, Dr Alberts was appointed Vice-President of the Atomic Energy Board, a post he held until his appointment, in 1977, as Director General and later President of the Council for Mineral Technology (MINTEK).

In June of 1984, he was awarded the Mintek Gold Medal for Leadership in the fields of Science and Technology. He was appointed Director-General of the Department of Mineral and Energy Affairs in July, 1984.

Dr Alberts has been National President of the SA Youth for Christ movement for some 28 years. He is a Gideon and a co-founder of Action Moral Standards.

The University will honour <u>Dr James Gear</u> for his outstanding contribution in the field of medicine. Dr Gear, who was born and educated in Germiston, is a graduate of the University of the Witwatersrand, where he was awarded the B.Sc. (Hons.) degree and subsequently the M.B., Ch.B. and D.P.H. qualifications.

He joined the South African Institute for Medical Research as Pathologist in 1930, and was to serve that body for forty three years, first as Deputy Director, and subsequently, from 1960 to 1973, as Director. During this period he furthered his studies at London University, where he obtained the D.T.M. & H. and the Diploma in Bacteriology.

Dr Gear's research interests cover a very wide field and include Haematology, Immunology, Tropical Medicines, Vaccines, and Virus Infections in Southern Africa. He has served on the World Health Organisation Expert Committees; is an Honorary Professor of Tropical Medicine at the University of the Witwatersrand, and a Member of the Health Advisory Council of the State Health Department. He also serves on the Prime Minister's Scientific Advisory Committee; the Committee for Research in Medical Science of the CSIR, and the South African Medical Research Council.

He has a formidable number of publications to his credit and has been the recipient of honours and awards too numerous to mention here. He holds Honorary degrees from both the University of the Witwatersrand and the University of the Orange Free State. Dr Gear is currently Consultant in Virology to the State Health Department, and Consultant in Tropical Medicine to the South African Institute for Medical Research.
