If everything had gone according to plan. "people's power" would have coursed through the streets of Bisho Ind. perhaps with a nudge horn muttneeringttoldiers. swept Cieltei military tulet Brigadiet Oupe guzo from his illicit thtione. Instead. guzois soldiers opened fire on marchers running through the gap in the Indet pettdenoe Stadium and hopes of a glorious leip-rig victory were dashed with the ante brutality as those of the demonstratou on Tienenmen SQHIN. i
