Dear Comrade Treasuref-General.

I apologise for the delay in sending on
to you the enclosed minutes and other related matters. This was due to
unforseen circumstances.

Reference is made in this letter to
salient points raised by your 011108 with our Regional Treasury, or to
matters particularly requiring your attention, arising from our past
three meetings. ,

1. NOVIB - Regarding your request for the requirements of
a balanced diet for a student per day, our treasury has
sent a request to the uedioal Committee, but no reply.
has so far hoen received from them.

2. LOGISTICS - a. Cde. Motsumi has reported that two cadres
whom he has trained at Bigwa are soon to be removed
elsewhere. As a matter of urgency, and in view of the
sensitive nature of his department, we appeal for two
reliable comrades as replacements.

b. Cde. Wolfie'indiosted when he was here
that when sending in requisitions for shoes and clothing
it would be helpful to include sizes. We are trying to
compile such information in the course of our inventory.

3. INVENTORY - We have now made a start in respect of the
vehicles and have prepared questionnaires for inventor-
ing ANC personnel. In this connection, we would be
grateful if you oould supply us with 5,000 record cards,
preferably lined and approximately 15 x 10m.m. This
would enable us to keep permanent and efficient records
of all the in?ontories-you have asked us to do.

4. PUBLICITY BROCHURE - The Chief Representative in Sweden
has advised us that Sweden is able to print such a broch-
.ure for distribution to all school children in Soundsn-
avia for their special fund-raising effort for SOMAFCO
in the autumn. The brochure, together with pictures will

be sent to you for your approval during the next week. We believe this brochure would be suitable for children in other countries, and if you agree with this assessment, we wondered if you would ask Comrade Lindiwe if she could get extra copies printed for distribution by Headquarters to ANC offices and support groups elsewhere. You would be in the best position to know what quantities would be required.

5. LIBRARY PROJECT- UNESCO - Your letter of 27th.

April make reference to this project. However, it is not clear if this is a project for SOMAFCO. When Cde. Ruth Lazarus was here she asked that we consider a project for the school library and we would naturally not wish to overlap with HQ on this matter. Please clarify this.

6. BBC FILM- IVAN STRASBURG - The Treasury would be grateful to hear from you as to whether this proposal was accepted or not.

7. I.C.C.M. HOLLAND. No reply from you to our letter of 25th. February has been received. We would appreciate knowing if we are required to prepare any further project information or report relating to this grant.

8. CUSO PROJECTS - We did not get confirmation or endorsement from you to our letter of 12 May 1981. We have therefore prepared 6 projects for consideration by CUSO at their meeting on 14th. July 1981. Copies of these will be forwarded to you in the next few days and we hope you will approve our action.

9. LOGISTICS (CONTINUED) - It would be helpful to us in timing our requisitions to Headquarters if we could be advised when your office requisitions should be made for supplies.
