I beg feo refer to the telephone conversations I have had with members of your Staff on the subject of a scholarship grant for my son.

We have three children: a boy, DALI, aged 14-, and two girls, TEMBI and TSELANE, aged 16 and 11 years respectively. All three children are at boarding schools.

DALI has been at Lancing College, Sussex, for two years, and my wife, who is a Nursing Sister, has been paying his fees, amounting to £300 per term. He is due to take his "0" level examinations in 1975*

Four weeks ago, our house caught fire. In the course of escaping from the fire my wife fell from a potion of the roof on to a concrete*: surface, and sustained a tripjhe fracture of her right femur. She is now at the Whittington Hospita 1, and the considered opinion of her doctors is that it will take a minimum of 12 months before she is able to resume work, and xiraxiixis there is no certainty that at that scage her normal earning capacity will not prove to have been seriously impaired.
