Marchers

- About 200 women and youths,

under the banner of the Inter-

The women, in various  
church uniforms and carrying

sang hymns while they marched  
from St Mary's Cathedral in  
Wanderers Street to police  
headquarters. -

The marchers, led by Mary

' Masechzba Mabhaso, were re-

er Brigadier-AJ Strauss, who  
invited the delegation of eight

Shortly after, a member of the Flying Squad reported that shots were fired at his vehicle within the squatier camp.

tified, brought the death toll  
from violence on the Reef  
on Wednesday to seven.  
Two men, one of whom  
had been shot and the other  
hacked to death, were  
found by police in

and the body of a man was

found in Vosloorus.
