

 Subject : Pre-Evaluation of flight on 23.04.1992

The flight on 23.04.1992 carried only 44 PAX, while the number of NO-SHOWs was also 44. A 50% success/failure rate. The detailed explanation for this poor performance rate is pending the next FCM. In order to prevent a similar situation with the next flight, it was decided to postpone the flight on the 28.04. to the 30.04.1992.

It was decided to start the process all over with a new DRAFT MANIFEST to be drawn up on the basis of the latest list from UNHCR (24.04.1992), incorporating flight on 16.04.1992, showing the following new break-down:

The DRAFT MANIFEST to be discussed and finalized at next FCM on Monday, 27.04.1992 at 12.00 hrs.

It was suggested that in future an informal meeting should be held immediately after the flight, viz. Thursdays at 15.00 hrs.

On the background of the very low number of PAX, the subject of NO-SHOWs was again discussed. UNHCR was in the process of drafting a letter outlining the consequences of NO-SHOW.



UNHCR would further request ANC for clearance for UNHCR and the IOM team to visit Mazimbu and Dakawa to discuss the problem of NO-SHOWs and its possible solution. Clearance to visit the settlements normally takes about two weeks, but as the matter was considered urgent, we would aim at going to MAZ/DAK on Tuesday 28.04.1992.


The subject of the flight configuration was again discussed following communication from IOM, GVA reminding us that a number of PAX lower than 112 was resulting in an increase of the price per PAX. It was repeated and underlined by UNHCR that it was no longer a question of cost/money but rather in order to honour the Memorandum of Understanding, entitling the repatriants to 50 kg of luggage each, the number of PAX on the charter had to be adjusted accordingly, as outlined in ATC's letter of 3 March 1992. The raising of the question at this point seemed slightly out of place, as this subject had been dealt with extensively and conclusively, both locally between UNHCR and IOM (see Minutes of Meeting on 14 March 1992), and from field offices to HQs and between HQs.

Another communication from IOM, GVA had made us aware of a new problem, viz PAX destined for ELS on the DAR/JNB flight on 23.04.1992 arriving with 623 kg excess luggage, incurring excess luggage expenses JNB/ELN.

As we only had 44 PAX and, the luggage situation was very comfortable and non-restricted, and to make the most of the charter, for which we are paying the full amount irrespective of the number of PAX, 6 extra pieces of luggage for JNB (left behind on 16.04.1992) were accepted. To avoid any misunderstanding it should be repeated that the acceptance of excess luggage did not affect the number of PAX. We simply did not have any more than 44 PAX showing up. It was not possible to explain off-hand the occurrence of 623 kg for ELS, as a.o. to our knowledge on ly 6 extra pieces of luggage for JNB were accepted, and according to the Nominal Roll there were only 2 PAX for ELS. The matter would have to be looked further into.

The next Flight Committee Meeting was fixed for Monday, 27 April 1992.

Ad Item 3 - Arrangement of flight on 28 April 1992

Amendments to the DRAFT MANIFEST were done for the FINAL MANIFEST to be sent out on 22.04.1992.

Date of Departure: 28 April 1992.  
 Time of Reporting: 10.00 hrs.  
 Time of Departure DAR: 13.00 hrs  
 Time of Arrival JNB: 15.30 hrs

The FINAL MANIFEST was signed by all parties.

Ad Item 4 - Evaluation of flight on 16.04.1992

The flight carried 82 PAX (62.12.8) and kg of luggage. Underload: 71 kg. Some luggage (above the 50 kg entitlement) was left behind. PAX were informed that we would try to accommodate in next flight.

The number of NO-SHOWS was 17 PAX.

The flight was delayed by 1 hour and 25 minutes, caused by A) delay in arrival of PAX from Mazimbu/Dakawa (approx 1 hour), and B) delay in arrival of air craft (approx 25 minutes).



Ad Item 5 - Finalisation of establishing of status of remaining caseload of Cleared/Not yet Departed PAX

The meeting was presented with a new UNHCR list of 21.04.1992, giving the information needed on the status of Cleared/Not yet departed PAX (Enclosure I), showing the following break-down:

The 22 "To be checked" were gone through, raising further 3 TR cases, which were included in the FINAL MANIFEST for the flight on 28 April 1992. The status of the 17 NO-SHOWS from the flight on 16.04.92 was reestablished for registration in the UNHCR list.

All TR = Travel Ready PAX in the present remaining case-load have now been manifested for the flights on 23.04. and 28.04.1992.


The concept of what is a valid reason for not travelling was discussed on the basis of the example of a person, who had expressed being not ready to travel as having to take care of family property in Tanzania. It was suggested that the people who are hesitant to leave be identified and informed thoroughly on the programme and asked for their decision on whether they will be travelling while the charter flights are operated, or whether by individual repatriation, which will affect entitlement to financial support, and the (residence) status in Tanzania. UNHCR agreed to issue a circular to that effect to the ANC and the PAC.

It was further agreed that in future only two NO-SHOWS would be accepted. After 2 NO-SHOWs the person would no longer hold the status of TR = Travel Ready, and would not be manifested until sufficient TR-confirmation had been received.

Item 6 - Status on new clearances

UNHCR had not received any new clearances since the 03.04.1992.
