DRAFT PROPOSAL FOR A REVISION OF PROJECT "PRE-SCHDDL EDUCATION FOR THE RESETTLEMENT PROGRAMME OF SOUTH AFRICAN REFUGEES"

1. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUNG

After the eth Of August 1990 Pretoria meeting between the African National Congress and the South African government, the situation of the South African exiles has drastically changed. Most of them are xpected to be returning to their country during 1991; many of them have already returned.

However, the Situatien remains very unstable: while many of the activists who have long been in exile are returning, others eecape anew from a situation of increasing violence.

The reforms which have been implemented up to new are not yet judged to have brought about irreversible change: the Internal Security Act is still being enforced, thereby producing new political detainees after the old ones have been released. The ANC is therefore continuing to implement and promote the projects in the heighbeuring ceuntriee aimed at providing support to the South African refugees. However, as a consequence of the new situation the needs of the refugees and the objectives DT those projects are being revised.

This is the case Of the Dakewa refugee camp, for which a new development plan has been produced during the last few months.

The African National Congress therefere a plementation of the above mentioned prejec revised plan could be completed and the me

It consequently invited Ceepe to meetihge in Johannesburg where a draft fer_revieieh Of the project, according to the new Situation and prospecte of the Dakawa camp, was discussed.

As the main item to be previded by the preject wee prefabricated constructions, a pFevieus research had been done in Europe on the needed quality in relation to the Dakawe climatic conditions and the caste.

In Johannesburg diecueeiene were held with the National project department, FEEDUHSible fer the overall Dakawa development lines; with the Dakawa prejecte department, including the architect planner Df Dakawag reeponeible for implementation of the construction part Of the project, and with the Nemen'e Section, responsible for the activitiee aimed at the well-being of women and children and their implementation. 4.3. EXPATRIATE PERSONNEL

It is requested that the two expatriate personnel on a long mieeion be converted into personnel on a short mission and be integrated by South African experts in the relevant training subjects. It is however agreed that 1 Beebe personnel with both the training and the implementation function as well as the project's coordination task will always be present in Dakawa during the project's period.

4.4. LOCAL PERSONNEL

It is requested that a budget item be opened, from the "unforeeen contingencies", which can provide for same of the local personnel to be salaried. This request stems from a new policy of the AND, which used to reward its personnel in Mind, by providing shelter, clothing and feed. The ANC wishes to change that personnel'e policy into one which can more effectively educate the people for entering the labour market and which can allow for measuring the capacity of the persen employed.
