+ The writer had a telephone conversation with Mr A.Killin, Political
Affairs Minister of the S.A.Embassy in Washington on 12th August,1985
on how to avoid further black-white clashes.

+ Writer supports R.Reagan's "cobstructive engagement".

+ Hopes "my available coming research" will benefit resolution of the
South African problem.

3. Containd a Mailing List of 32 names, a random list of international
personnilities to whom a message was sent "to avoid bloodshed in S.A."

U. Letter to Christopher Ross dated 8/9/85
