ANC, AZAPO AND PAC PRESS STATEMENT OF THE JOINT MEETING OF THEIR WORKING COMMITTEES 25 SEPTEMBER, 1991

- 1. The Joint Working Committees of the three organisations the ANC, PAC and Azapo involved in preparing for and convening the Patriotic Front Conference, met in Johannesburg on 25 September, 1991.
- 2. The meeting agreed upon a joint working document for submission to the Executives of the three organisations for ratification.
- 3. The joint working committees identified the premise that the three organisations agreed upon for the holding of the Patriotic Front Conference, namely that:
- * the immediate task of the broad liberation movement in the current phase is the transfer of political power to the people;
- * there are possibilities for such a transfer of power to take place through negotiations, which implies some form of contact with the regime;
- * the only legitimate forum for the creation of a new constitution is a Constituent Assembly, elected on the basis of one person, one vote on a common voters' roll; and
- * the formation of a broad patriotic front constitutes a crucial element in empowering the broad liberation movement for these tasks.
- 4. There was consensus regarding the agenda of the Patriotic Front Conference, which would include:
- * The All-Party Congress/Pre-Constituent Assembly Conference, which would cover
 - modalities for transition
 - Agenda for this conference, which would include:
 - a) Interim Government/Transitional Authority
 - b) Modalities for constituting the Constituent Assembly
 - c) Principles which would underpin a future constitution for South Africa
- 5. Common agreement was reached on the need for "independent" facilitators as a mechanism for convening the APC/Pre-CA Conference, as well as with regard to the venue, funding and infrastructure for such a conference.
- 6. Agreement was also reached on a minimum common approach regarding an Interim Government/Transitional Authority.
