Japan Socialist Party head  
Takako Doi proposed Wednesday  
that Japan make available  
' spaces for South African blacks  
in Japanese universities.  
Doi, who is slated to meet with  
African National Congress lead-  
er Nelson Mandela next week in  
Oslo, made the proposal in a  
meeting with Prime Minister  
Toshiki Kaifu.  
Doi told reporters following the  
meeting that Kaifu appeared  
open to the idea.  
Doi and Mandela are expected  
to meet while attending a four-  
day international peace confer-  
ence to be held in Oslo Aug. 26-  
29 under the sponsorship of the  
' Nobel Prize Committee and  
other organizations.  
Mandela is slated to visit  
Japan in September.

 Mandela to Visit  
 To Seek Assistance  
 OSLO (Asahi Shimbun)--  
 Black South African leader  
 Nelson Mandela, visiting  
 Norway to attend an international  
 peace symposium  
 sponsored by the Nobel  
 Peace Prize Committee, said  
 Sunday that he plans to visit  
 Japan either in late September  
 or in early October.  
 Mandela, vice president of  
 the African National Congress  
 (ANC), disclosed his  
 intent to visit Japan at talks  
 here with Takako Doi, chair-  
 woman (if the Japan Socialist  
 Party.  
 According to Doi, Mandela  
 strongly hopes Japan will  
 offer educational assistance  
 to young black South Africans,  
 particularly in such fields  
 as construction and mechanical  
 engineering, business management,  
 financing, technology to mine  
 rare metals and metallurgy.

 at the symposium a reorganization  
 of the United Nations  
 and a ban on arms exports  
 for creating a new world order  
 to follow the end of the  
 long Cold War setup as well  
 as to cope with the current
