Dear Comrade Rica,

I hope this letter will find you in good health my love. I'm fine, except for the nasty experience I had, when I came from Dar, of being detained at the airport for 3 days, because I was not cleared. Still worse I was jailed in Botswana for 7 days for entering the country being a P.I., in spite of the fact that I had a Botswana visa.

Rica dear I regret to say I was disgusted to see the transport from Morogoro (bus and landrover) bringing only 3 small cardboard boxes of mine and the bulk of the things being left behind.

It is ridiculous to suggest that those things need a big lorry when the landrover was full of small parcels, which could have been easily placed under the bus-seats. Suitcases and bags could not have damaged the seats in anyway. All heavy things could have been put in the landrover.

I am writing you this letter because I am concerned that my goods might go the same way other comrades' goods have gone, if they have not gone already. In that light I have asked comrade Doodles to allow you to see if my things are still in tact. I have asked him that the goods be put in crates and send by rail as soon as possible. They must be insured. I have stopped the logistics dept. here from buying me household goods, because I was expecting those to arrive soon.

The goods are as follows:-

- 1 big cardboard box
- 1 tin trunk
- 1 bin
- 1 wooden box
- 1 bookshelf in crate

I trust you will do your best as always. I see your name features prominently in Gordon Winter's book "Inside Boss".
