RPC/National and Regional Education Structures.

The chairlady opened the meeting, and there was long discussion of the agenda that was presented as follows:-

- 1. Regional education matters.
- 2. Working relations amongst RPC/ National and regional education.
- 3. Preparation for comrade Mandela's visit.

The floor was given to the chairman of RPC who started with the first point of the agenda by categorising the students as follows:-

- Local, Chelstone, Transit, SOMAFCO, Military and Adults.

He explained all the problems faced by the RPC such as accommodation, Logistics, and sholarship. He further mentined the involvement of students in our Political life and also about the student getting scholarship in RSA.

The meeting discussed the problems faced by the local students including those coming from SOMAFCO because their parents are based in Lusaka. Most of the problems of the students from MAZIMBU are due to the new developments faced by the ANC and the repatriation. They feel that they are left out.

The National Education Committee explained that all students from MAZIMBU who come for holidays in Lusaka are supposed to go back, that was the agreement between them, the students and parents.

The chairlady explained that the secretary of National Education was prepared to continue servicing students who are in the region not those one's coming from MAZIMBU.

The chairman of the RPC further explained how particular services of comrades are recommended from their departments, also recomendation are made by RPC as in cases of orphans in the region who are South Africans.

The National Education explained that due to the problem of fund resources its not possible to help all those cases, these could be taken to UN.

The chairman of the RPC told the comrades that all departments have a right of responding positive or negative to the RPC as far as the recomedations are made.

The meeting felt that it could not make some agreements because some of the departments were not presented, especially the RTO and CRO.

The chairman of the RPC clarified the services of RTO and CRO and that meetings of the nature suggested would eventually be organised.

## PROPOSALS: -

The discussion of the meeting should be taken to the SGO. The RPC to organise a meeting with SGO and Education.

- RPC to make a memorandum to SGO together with one delegate from each departments, or to go to the RSA.

The National Education explained that all cases coming from RSA or out of our region are suppose to be handled by the CRO and RPC also looking into the problem of resources.

Meanwhile looking for a solution of primary and secondary students the RPC will continue serving the comrades.

The National Education will only take care of students coming from the RSA not from SOMAFCO simple because they have all those possibilities of attending clases.

The meeting at the end of the day agreed that:-

- 1. The existing NEC directive on secondary students was not applicable in the present conditions and need to be reviewed in the light of SOMAFCO swelling and existance of repatriation mood and atmosphere.
- 2. Despite the above Lusaka structures should not encourage the

exodus of students to our region, but the attention of the NEC needed to be drawn to this situation.

- 3. Some of the problems were not the making of either or our structures servicing students in this region, but their origins were from the overall problems of the movement.
- 4. Only one meeting could not resolve all problems faced in the student front.

The DOE/REC agreed to making guadeline documents to be used for preparing the forthcoming meeting with the Deputy President.

Meeting was adjourned to a later date.
